Operation Round Up grant benefits Fisher House

Each month, thousands of CHELCO members round their monthly bill to the next whole dollar amount, donating the spare change to Operation Round Up. That spare change is then donated through grants to local non-profit organizations throughout our service territory. Recently, Fisher House of the Emerald Coast received a \$5,000 grant from the memberfunded Operation Round Up.

The Fisher House on Eglin Air Force Base was founded in 2007 and provides a home for military families when a member of their family is undergoing medical treatment at a local facility. The Fisher House is within walking distance of the Eglin Air Force Base Hospital and Veteran's Clinic.

Fisher House Executive Director Mia Hughes says that the home and its 12 suites provide temporary lodging for around 1,000 guests each year. They also partner with local hotels to ensure families have a place to stay when their home is fully occupied. Through COVID-19, they have continued to serve the military and their families.

"Our home remained open throughout the pandemic, restricting access to life-ending, lifesaving or emergent cases only," Hughes said.

We encourage all members to vote in CHELCO's Board of Trustees elections every April, and we invite all members to participate in co-op annual meetings to share their voices with us. Membership is open to everyone in our service territory, and we gladly welcome thousands of new members to the CHELCO family each year.

While our top priority is providing safe, reliable and affordable energy,

we also want to be a catalyst for good in our community. We invest in our community through scholarship programs, charitable giving, educational programs and more. Our Operation Round Up program has distributed nearly \$50,000 to local charitable organizations over the past three years. We strive to make long-term decisions that improve and enrich the communities we serve.

While some things have changed quite a bit since CHELCO opened its doors in 1940, our cooperative values have stood the test of time and still guide our every action to this day. Just like we have for the past eight decades, we will continue to promote the betterment of our community while keeping the lights on. It's the co-op way.
